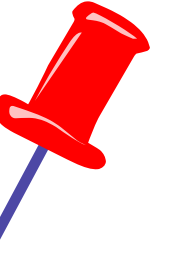

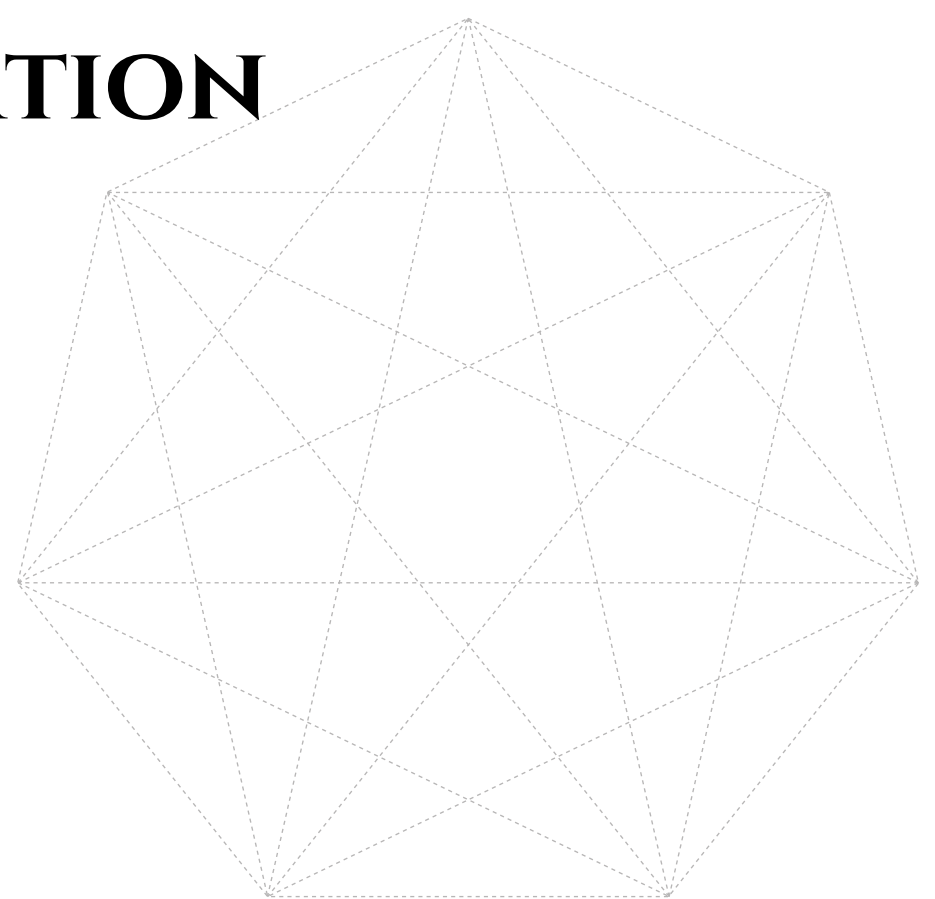

APPLICATION DATES

As part of the Erasmus+ “2026-1-TR01-KA131-HED-000408437” Project Study Mobility Applications, applications from students who wish to benefit from the Erasmus+ Study Mobility will be accepted ONLINE between 14.09.2026 – 01.10.2026. You can submit your Erasmus+ Study Mobility application via turnaportal.ua.gov.tr. Please carefully read the Online Application Guide published regarding the application system.

ERASMUS+ ENGLISH LANGUAGE EXAM

The Erasmus+ English Language Exam will be held face-to-face at our university. The exam consists of a single session. Further details regarding the exam will be announced later.

Note: Students are required to bring their student ID cards with them during the exam, show their ID to the instructor conducting the exam before the exam starts, and sign the attendance sheet.

Students without a student ID card will not be admitted to the exam, and the exams of students whose signatures are not on the attendance sheet will be considered invalid.

Participation in the exam is mandatory for Erasmus+ Study Mobility. A minimum score of 70 points is required to participate in the mobility.

ATTENTION!

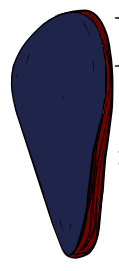
Language proficiency exams such as YDS, TOEFL, and IELTS are **NOT ACCEPTED.**

Important Considerations:

*Students who are entitled to receive a grant within the scope of Erasmus+ Study Mobility may receive a grant for one semester.

*The mobilities to be carried out under this announcement are limited to the duration of the 2026-1-TR01-KA131-HED-000408437 project.

*Erasmus+ Study and Internship Mobility can be carried out for a total of up to 12 months at each study cycle (first cycle: associate and bachelor's degree; second cycle: master's degree; third cycle: doctoral degree and medical specialization). The total mobility period (study + internship) at each study cycle cannot exceed 12 months.

Who Can Apply?

- Students participating in the activity must be full-time students at Istanbul Nişantaşı University.
- The student must be enrolled as a full-time student in a higher education programme at any level of formal education (first, second, or third cycle) within a higher education institution.
- First-cycle students must have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least **2.20/4.00**.
- For associate degree transfer students whose transcript has not yet been issued at the time of application, the associate degree graduation grade must be at least **2.20/4.00**.
- For preparatory class and first-year students, the high school graduation grade must be at least **75/100**.
- Second- and third-cycle students must have a cumulative GPA of at least **2.50/4.00**.
- Students enrolled in a Double Major/Minor Programme may apply through only one major programme.
- Students who have previously participated in an Erasmus+ mobility activity at the same or a previous study cycle may also apply. However, it should be noted that Erasmus+ study and traineeship mobility can be undertaken for a maximum total of **12 months** at each study cycle.

Who Cannot Apply?

- Students enrolled in Scientific Preparation Programmes or Open and Distance Learning Programmes are not eligible to apply for Erasmus+ Mobility.
- Students who have frozen/suspended their enrolment are not eligible to apply.
- Students who are continuing their education at our university through any exchange programme are not eligible to apply.
- Final-year students are not eligible to apply for Erasmus+ Study Mobility. Final-year students may only apply for Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility.

Attention: Students who have not renewed their registration and students who are in graduation status are not eligible to apply for Erasmus+ Mobility.



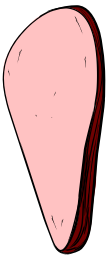
Erasmus+ Study Mobility Application Requirements

1. The student must be an active student enrolled in a higher education programme at any level of formal education (Associate, Bachelor's, or Graduate level) within a higher education institution.
2. a) For Bachelor's/Associate Degree students, the cumulative grade point average (GPA) must be at least 2.20/4.00.
2. b) For Master's and PhD students, the cumulative GPA must be at least 2.50/4.00.

Students who do not meet these criteria are not eligible to apply. Having one or more failed courses from previous semesters does not prevent students from applying for Erasmus+ Mobility.

3. Within the student's current study cycle, the total duration of higher education mobility activities undertaken under Erasmus+ and the Lifelong Learning Programme (LLP), together with the planned Study and Traineeship Mobility periods, must not exceed 12 months.
4. Master's and PhD students who apply during their first semester and whose transcript has not yet been issued by our university are not eligible to apply.
5. For students who have transferred from another higher education institution and for whom no GPA has yet been established at our university, the GPA stated in the transcript issued by their previous higher education institution will be taken into consideration.





ATTENTION!

Students are required to ensure that their Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) displayed in the OBIS system is up-to-date and accurate BEFORE the application process. Since the GPA available in the system at the time of application will be taken into consideration, students are strongly advised to check their OBIS records and, if applicable, have any missing courses or grades corrected through the Student Affairs Office. Please note that any corrections made after the completion of the application process will not be taken into consideration.

Evaluation Criteria

In the evaluation process; **50%** of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) and **50%** of the Foreign Language Score are taken into consideration. The sum of these scores constitutes the final score (Erasmus+ Score).

★ According to the evaluation criteria specified below, in order for a student to be considered successful, the final score (Erasmus+ Score) must be at least 64 points for Erasmus+ Study Mobility.

Reminder: The passing threshold for the Erasmus English Language Examination is also a minimum of 70 points for Erasmus+ Study Mobility.

The selection criteria and weighted scores to be used in the evaluation of applications

<i>Participating in mobility in the country of citizenship</i>	-10 points
<i>Failing to participate in the mobility without submitting a waiver notification in due time despite being selected</i>	-10 points
<i>Applying to two types of mobility at the same time (deduction is applied to the student's preferred mobility type)</i>	-10 points
<i>For students selected for mobility: Unexcused non-attendance at meetings/trainings organized by the higher education institution regarding mobility (applied if the student reapplies for Erasmus)</i>	-5 points
<i>Declaring to take the language exam but failing to take it without a valid excuse (applied if the student reapplies for Erasmus)</i>	-5 points

******Combat veterans and their spouses and children, as well as the spouses and children of war martyrs, together with the spouses and children of those who, pursuant to Article 21 of the Anti-Terrorism Law No. 3713 dated 12/4/1991, were injured, became disabled, died or were killed as a result of being subjected to terrorist acts while performing their duties as public officials domestically or abroad, or due to performing such duties even after their official status had ended, and civilians who lost their lives or became disabled due to the coup attempt and terrorist act carried out on 15 July 2016 and subsequent acts of a similar nature pursuant to Article 7 of the Decree Law No. 667 dated 23 July 2016, as well as their spouses and children, shall be given priority if they apply for Erasmus+ student mobility.

******For study mobility, the evaluation shall be carried out by the decision of the relevant Unit Commission, while for traineeship mobility, it shall be carried out by the decision of the Erasmus Institutional Coordination Office Commission.

*******For priority consideration, the student must submit, during the application period, an official document from the Ministry of Family and Social Services stating that a protection, care or accommodation decision has been issued for the student pursuant to Law No. 2828.

Quotas

The total number of available places within the scope of project No. 2026-1-TR01-KA131-HED-000408437 is **60**. The available places have been distributed on a faculty basis. The faculty and quota information is provided in the table below. If there are no applications from a particular faculty, the quota allocated to that faculty will be given to the highest-scoring student, taking into consideration the ranking of all students from all faculties. Students who apply will be ranked according to their success scores. Students included in the main list will be entitled to participate in the mobility with a grant. Students remaining on the reserve list may participate in the mobility without a grant, provided that they submit a petition within the specified period.

Monthly Grant Amounts by Country of Destination

Students are provided with grants to help cover the additional expenses incurred as a result of being abroad during their activity period. Grants are not intended to cover all of the students' expenses related to the activity, but are provided only as a contribution. No additional support is provided for round-trip travel expenses for Erasmus+ mobility.

The countries where student mobility activities can be carried out are divided into three groups according to their standard of living, and monthly Erasmus+ grant amounts have been determined for each country group. The country groups and the monthly grant amounts to be provided to students traveling to these countries are presented in the table below:

To contribute to students' travel expenses, the distance between the starting point of the mobility and the location where the activity takes place should be determined using the distance calculator provided by the European Commission, and the travel grant should be calculated using the table below. The amount corresponding to the distance band shown in the distance calculator is the round-trip travel grant amount indicated in the table below, and this amount should not be multiplied by two.

Green Travel

Green travel refers to traveling by using low-carbon emission means of public transportation. Bus, train, and carpooling are considered forms of green travel. In order to be eligible for green travel support, green travel must be used for both the outbound and return journeys, and more than half of the total journey must be completed using green means of transport.

EU Academy: Online Linguistic Support (OLS)

Scope of Online Linguistic Support

Support will be provided to students and staff participating in mobility activities in the field of higher education through the European Commission's institutional learning management platform, "EU Academy." Over time, the system will gradually provide language learning services in all 29 official languages of the EU Member States and countries associated with the Erasmus+ and ESC programmes.



IMPORTANT!

Important Points to Consider During the Application Process for Erasmus Study Mobility

*Erasmus Study Mobility applications will be submitted via turnaportal.ua.gov.tr between 14 September 2026 and 01 October 2026. Applications will definitely not be accepted after the specified dates.

*For academic matters, students should contact their Erasmus Departmental Coordinators regarding all questions.

Erasmus+ Programme Special Needs Support

Additional Grant Support will be provided to participants with fewer opportunities, in addition to the grant they are entitled to receive. In order for this grant to be provided, a participant with fewer opportunities is defined as an individual who is economically and socially disadvantaged and falls under the following subcategories:

- 1.Those who are or have been subject to Law No. 2828 (those for whom a protection, care, or accommodation decision has been made by the Ministry of Family and Social Services pursuant to Law No. 2828)
- 2.Students for whom a protection, care, or accommodation decision has been made in the past or currently under the Child Protection Law No. 5395
- 3.Those receiving an orphan’s/death pension
- 4.Spouses and children of martyrs/veterans, as well as veterans themselves(22)
- 5.Students who provide a document proving that they, their family, or their guardian receive support from a public institution (such as Municipalities, Ministries, Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundations, the General Directorate of Foundations, the Turkish Red Crescent, etc.) at the time of application
- 6.Persons with disabilities(23)
- 7.Those whose parent or guardian receives a disability or needy allowance under Law No. 2022 dated 01.07.1976 on the Monthly Allowance for Turkish Citizens Aged 65 and Over Who Are Needy, Weak, and Without Anyone to Care for Them, and for Disabled and Needy Turkish Citizens(24)
- 8.Those who themselves or whose first-degree relatives (biological/step) receive disaster victim assistance from AFAD.(25)

Scholarships provided by the Credit and Dormitories Institution (KYK) and similar scholarships, other grants, assistance, and scholarships in the nature of merit-based scholarships, and one-time financial assistance are not considered within the scope of the financial assistance specified above. Upon request and provided that they document their status, students who fall within the scope specified above will be provided with Additional Grant Support in the amounts indicated below, depending on the type of mobility:

Mobility type	Additional Grant Support Amount
2 – 12 months student mobility	Monthly 250 €
5 – 14 days short-term student mobility*	100 € in addition to the daily grant total
15 – 30 days short-term student mobility*	150 € in addition to the daily grant total

** No additional support is provided for traineeships in this case.*

The spouses and children of those defined under Article 21 of the Anti-Terrorism Law No. 3713 dated 12/4/1991 as “public officials who, while performing their duties domestically or abroad, or even after their official status has ended, are injured, disabled, deceased, or killed as a result of being subjected to terrorist acts due to the performance of these duties” The spouses and children of those who lost their lives, or civilians who became disabled, as a result of the coup attempt and terrorist act carried out on 15 July 2016 and acts constituting a continuation thereof, pursuant to Article 7 of Decree-Law No. 667 dated 23 July 2016, as well as the spouses and children of such persons Persons who have suffered material losses due to terrorist acts or activities carried out as part of the fight against terrorism under Law No. 5233 on the Compensation of Losses Resulting from Terrorist Acts and Counter-Terrorism Activities, as well as their spouses and children shall be given priority if they apply for Erasmus+ student mobility.

25. This support is applied once for each project type (KA131/KA171). If the student participates in mobility, Additional Grant Support under this category will not be provided again for the student’s subsequent mobilities based on the same document.

Grant Deductions

The Higher Education Institution shall make grant deductions in the following cases, provided that these are announced before the mobility and stipulated in the agreement:

a) Deduction in Case of Failure: For students who fail, a deduction proportional to the level of failure shall be made, amounting to no less than 5% of the total actual number of activity days on which the grant calculation is based. The Higher Education Institution must determine the deduction rate and reasons for deductions due to failure in advance, announce them to students participating in the mobility, stipulate them in the grant agreement to be signed with the student, and apply the same deduction amount for the same circumstances in accordance with the principles of equality and transparency.

b) Deduction in Case of Failure to Complete the Participant Report: Students who fail to complete the participant report, except for technical reasons, shall have a deduction of 20% of the total actual number of activity days on which the grant calculation is based.

c) Full Repayment of the Grant Paid: If documents proving participation in the mobility (a certificate of participation or, alternatively, a Transcript of Records (ToR) issued after the return) are not submitted, the mobility shall be considered invalid and no grant shall be paid to the student; the grant initially paid shall be recovered.

***For technical issues you experience regarding applications, you may send an email to erasmus@nisantasi.edu.tr. Students who submit their applications with incorrect or incomplete information will not have the right to modify their applications again. Therefore, students should be careful when submitting their applications.**
